Sometimes, after the High Holidays, there may be the tendency to feel a slight sense of let-down. The anticipation and working toward the "Big Days," including the nervousness: Will I deliver the right message? Will my words hit home? Will people be inspired by the prayers, the music and the camaraderie? The Sanctuary is full for a few days. I get to see familiar faces as well as many new faces. There is excitement in the air and it is palpable. And then, we are back to normal. The beautiful purewhite Torah covers are put away and the Torah scrolls are re-dressed in their familiar covers. There is the possibility of the sense of let-down creeping in.

In reality however, there is so much happening at Temple Beth EI that there is no time to look back...only ahead. Our Shabbat School is up and running with an enthusiastic and dedicated faculty and eager children who play a big part in every Shabbat morning service. Our Sanctuary is filled with smiling, happy people who are truly excited about celebrating Shabbat each and every week in community. QUESTION:

Is there a connection between the Jewish holiday of Sukkot and the American holiday of Thanksgiving?

ANSWER:


Sukkot and Thanksgiving are both holidays that express gratitude for a bountiful harvest and take place in the fall. Some believe that the Pilgrims modeled Thanksgiving after Sukkot, and the following are seven ways the two holidays are indeed connected:



- 1. <u>Biblical knowledge:</u> The Pilgrims were well-acquainted with the Hebrew Bible and Jewish holidays, including Sukkot.
- 2. Family and community: Both holidays are centered around family and communal gathering.
- 3. Food and feasting: Both holidays involve a lot of food and feasting.
- 4. <u>Outdoor dining:</u> The first Thanksgiving meal was likely eaten outdoors, similar to Sukkot food in the outdoor sukkah.
- 5. <u>Welcoming:</u> Thanksgiving welcomed the Wampanoag Native Americans, similar to how Jews are encouraged to welcome friends and family to the sukkah.
- 6. <u>Length:</u> Both holidays are multi-day celebrations: Thanksgiving was originally a three-day feast, and Sukkot is a seven-day holiday.
- 7. <u>Jewish traditions</u>: Pilgrim leader William Bradford incorporated Jewish traditions into his first Thanksgiving prayers, including reciting Psalm 107.

FREE Open to the Public Marcus Sheff - CEO of The Institute for Monitoring Peace and Cultural Tolerance in School Education (IMPACT-se), a research and policy nonprofit that analyzes textbooks, employing standards on peace and tolerance as derived from UNESCO declarations and resolutions, and presents recommendations to governments, ministries of education, and policymakers.



Sheff was a political reporter at The Nation; an editor at The Jerusalem Post; and a foreign correspondent before heading The Word Shop, a strategic communications

firm, for a decade. He worked for Dow Jones International; Advanstar Inc.; and was CEO at Intermedia, an international business development firm, before becoming Executive Director at The Israel Project. Marcus has for two decades been involved in global healthcare. Briefing world leaders, he has spoken at the United Nations and parliaments, appears regularly in the media, and been published in multiple foreign policy outlets.

Sheff studied political science and international relations at Leeds University, where he was an elected leader of the student union, and international relations at Tel Aviv University.

He was named a J100 most influential person in the Jewish world.




